## November Mission Focus: ACTC Thanksgiving Food Baskets

The Assistance Center of Towson Churches (ACTC) has asked again for our help in their annual Thanksgiving basket ministry. Each year, ACTC's church partners team up to provide holiday meals to local neighbors in need. Through ACTC last year, more than 3,000 local families were blessed with a feast for five, including a turkey or \$15 in grocery gift cards towards purchase of a turkey. Last year Hunt's pledged 100 bags and delivered 75 physical bags and \$1150. While donations exceeded our goal, it's easiest for ACTC when we deliver completed bags and they can apply monetary donations to gift cards. Shopping for and packing bags can be a fun activity for families who want to experience hands-on mission to those in need.

This year Hunt's has pledged to deliver 80 bags of food. Bags are expected to be \$30 or so. They will NOT include a meat entrée (like beef stew) this year. Here's are some ways we hope you will help:

- **Purchase pre-packed bags** of Thanksgiving meal items from local grocery stores (see below) and bring them to church on November 5 and 12.
- Prepare bags of food items using the enclosed shopping list and bring them to church on November 5 and 12
- Purchase \$15 grocery store gift cards and bring them to church on November 5 and 12.
- Make a monetary donation to the effort by donating by check or electronically to Hunt's indicating ACTC Thanksgiving Baskets in the memo line. Hunt's will pass through 100% of your donation to ACTC
- **Bring your donations to the Agapé House** during business hours prior to 11/15/2022, if you are unable to make it to church on either of the designated Sundays.
- Reach out to schedule a pick-up: text/call or email Dave McMillan (410-916-0892 or <a href="mailto:dmcm6366@aol.com">dmcm6366@aol.com</a>) for the McMillans to pick up your donation if you are unable to bring it to church
- Consider volunteering your time and muscle to ACTC during the drive receiving or distributing the donations
   you can sign up at <a href="https://www.actonline.info/volunteer">www.actonline.info/volunteer</a>

As in the past, we will deliver the bags to Trinity Episcopal Church on November 16 to 18. The food will be distributed to families on the following Monday and Tuesday, November 21 and 22. #### **Finance Corner**

THE END IS NEAR! (of the year, that is)

After nine months of the new year, our financial performance is summarized in the following table:

Offering of \$12,946 in September was well below the budget of \$19,925. For the year, offering of \$265,563 is still slightly above the budget of \$259,394. Expenses are running close to budget, which means our bottom-line shortfall year-to-date of \$32,651 is \$12,335 better than what we budgeted. While this is good news – always better to outperform a budget than not to – we shouldn't lose sight of the fact that our budget presents a challenging picture as we consciously invested in staff and programs this year, even though we knew it would lead to a painful shortfall of \$54,732.

While it is unlikely that we can avoid a shortfall for the year, we can still make it as small as possible. Please consider increasing your giving as we approach the end of the year. Throughout our 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration, we often reflected on how blessed we are as a congregation. Part of this blessing stems from the generosity of those who came before us. Let's do what we can to ensure future generations feel blessed by the actions we take today.

#### Moment in Time: 1919

#### Hunt's Church Hosts World War I Dinner

On November 26, 1919, Hunt's Methodist Episcopal Church hosted a welcome home dinner given by relatives and friends in honor of their returned soldiers, sailors, and marines from WWI.



Most likely the month of November was chosen for the celebration as it would have been the one-year anniversary of the Armistice signed November 11, 1918. Also by the fall of 1919, the Spanish flu epidemic was no longer a threat, and social activities such as church events were in full swing again. Armistice Day, later becoming known as Veterans Day in 1954, is celebrated every year on November 11th in the United States.

The invitation to the dinner was in the form of a small hand-sized booklet, the cover of which is shown here. An original invitation from 1919 is displayed in an album stored in the church's Bicentennial Parlor.

The menu for the evening as printed in the invitation was as follows:


The invitation also included the names of two young men who died in the war. Listed in

memoriam were Lt. John McCarty and Pvt. Edward Stocksdale. They were among the nearly 2000 Marylanders who lost their lives serving in WWI.

Most likely some of my relatives were in attendance that evening, as my paternal grandfather, Leonard Meyers, was a veteran of WWI and a member of Hunt's in 1919. And sadly to say, *Pvt. Edward Stocksdale*, listed in memoriam, was the youngest brother of another church member, Anna Stocksdale, who married my grandfather in 1922, becoming my grandmother.
